



Spay & Neuter Animal Transport

Purpose: Help reduce animal overpopulation by transporting shelter animals to/from the Oakland Spay & Neuter Surgery Center and the Oakland Adoption Center for their spay or neuter surgery. This is a critical piece in the adoption process. As soon as our animals are altered, they can go to their forever homes!

Location: Oakland Adoption Center located at 8323 Baldwin Street. Parking is available onsite.

Key Responsibilities:

- Transfer cats, dogs, puppies, and kittens from their kennels into crates
- Load crated animals into East Bay SPCA van
- Drive animals in van to the Spay/Neuter Clinic
- Unload crated animals at the Spay/Neuter Clinic

Time Commitment:

- A two-hour weekly shift; shifts available from 8:30-9:30am **OR** 3:00-4:30pm on Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday.
- We ask each volunteer to make a six-month minimum commitment, but we hope you stay longer!

Training & Support:

- The Volunteer Services Manager is available for questions and assistance
- The Shelter Medicine Team and Spay Neuter Clinic Staff are available to assist with animal handling, loading/unloading

Requirements & Qualifications:

- Must be 18 or older
- Provide copy of current CA driver's license
- Provide copy of proof of insurance
- Comfortable driving one of East Bay SPCA's vans
- Use positive reinforcement and fear free techniques to transfer animals
- Drive safely, carefully, and courteously
- Follow all guidelines outline in the East Bay SPCA Volunteer Driver Agreement
