## NATIONAL PET CARE FOR ALL DAY

We founded National Pet Care for All Day (April 24) to raise awareness of the importance of making pet care accessible to all pet owners. In honor of our founding day in 1874, we celebrated our legacy of community-focused collaboration and innovation spanning 150 years.

"For us, National Pet Care for All Day is a call to action for inclusivity," shares Kristen Beitzel, VP of Medical Services at East Bay SPCA. "Every pet owner, regardless of their circumstances, deserves access to essential care and resources for their pet."

National Pet Care for All Day celebrates our efforts to provide accessible care for pets, eliminating the need to choose between self-care and pet care. "We're here to support people in making their furry friends' lives even better," remarks Marti, a longtime volunteer.

## SMOOCHES FOR POOCHES

We are proud and excited to share that our Smooches for Pooches Program celebrated another record-breaking year. The program, a partnership with teachers and schools in our community, visited more classrooms this year than ever before. Every February, our team partners with teachers to support students in coming up with fundraising ideas to support our work. Following the class fundraising, we visit classrooms to teach programs about compassion, share stories of adoptable animals, make valentines for our shelter animals, and bring a dog visitor for a meet-and-greet. "This program is an opportunity for students to learn about the importance of having compassion for all living things, while demonstrating how their actions can make a big difference in our community," says Heather Franco, Humane Education Manager.

We are grateful for the partnership of these teachers and their schools, who raised over \$20,000 this year to support our lifesaving programs. "It

really is the teachers who drive the program. They believe in our organization enough to help their students raise money for us and trust us to come into their classroom with an animal to meet with their students," emphasizes Heather.

Fostering compassion for animals in students is an important part of our mission. By investing in our youth, we are promoting a brighter, more compassionate future for animals.



### PARTNERSHIPS FOR PET WELLNESS

Community is central to East Bay SPCA's vision. Through collective efforts, we cultivate a culture of kindness and care, envisioning a future where every pet is valued and thrives. Partnerships with like-minded organizations help us empower individuals to deepen their connections with their pets, fostering empathy, understanding, and companionship.

Through these collaborations, we are at the forefront of expanding the focus of animal welfare to emphasize keeping pets and people together. We work closely with human services organizations to provide vital resources and break down barriers for both pets and people. In 2023, our partnerships allowed us to provide over 288,000 meals to pets through our Pet Food Pantry Program and enabled 94 pets to be seen by external veterinary clinics through our Humane Advocacy Program.

One of our key partners is the San Leandro Community Food Bank, which helps individuals and families facing food insecurity. Joining forces, we enhance their offerings to include regular supplies of pet food for community members; we're meeting people where they are already getting assistance.



"Together, we ensure that families facing food insecurity can keep their furry companions by their side, providing not just sustenance, but comfort and companionship during challenging times," emphasizes Moira Fry, San Leandro Community Food Pantry Treasurer.

We're also proud to partner with The Animal Care Hospital of Walnut Creek. They exemplify excellence in veterinary care and share our dedication to animal well-being. Through this partnership, we extend essential medical services to pets in need, regardless of their circumstances, enabling them to receive the care they deserve.

Merlinda Yu, Senior Manager at Animal Care Hospital of Walnut Creek, underscores our shared goal of promoting the well-being of animals, "Together, we work towards a shared goal of promoting the health and happiness of animals in our community."

Focusing on the human-animal bond among unhoused individuals and low-income residents, People Animals Love and Support East Bay (PALS East Bay) represents another dimension of our collaborative efforts. By providing free medical care for pets, we not only eliminate preventable diseases but also uphold the dignity of pet owners. "The need for medical care for pets is so high that it is imperative we have partnering clinics to allow our Humane Advocacy team to support as many animals and their families as possible," says Kristen Beitzel, Vice President of Medical Services at East Bay SPCA. "Partnering with East Bay SPCA has made it possible for me to provide more to the folks I serve, whether it's training or care they receive or food," says Jessica Lefebre, founder of PALS East Bay. "The partnership and knowing that I have resources available if I need them empowers me to say yes to clients when otherwise I wouldn't be able to."
