### ADDITIONAL FEES:

<b>Fee</b>	<b>Description</b>	<b>DOG</b>	<b>CAT</b>
Brachycephalic	This fee is for pets who are flat-faced or short-nosed (i.e. Pugs, Bull Dogs, Persians, etc.) These animals are considered higher risk for anesthesia and require extra monitoring during recovery to make sure they are breathing normally.	\$58 + the cost of anti- nausea injection	\$46 + the cost of anti- nausea injection
Cryptorchid (Inguinal Only)	This fee is for male pets who have one or both testicles undescended and the testicle is stuck in the groin area. We <u>do not do</u> surgery on male pets who have an undescended testicle stuck in the abdomen.	\$56 (per testicle)	\$35 (per testicle)
In-Heat	This fee is for female pets who are either currently in-heat or recently finished a heat cycle. This condition is considered a higher risk for surgery because the reproductive tissue is more fragile, and the surgery can take longer than usual.	\$77	\$36
Pregnancy	This fee is for female pets who are pregnant at the time of surgery. The pregnancy is aborted at the time of surgery.	\$82	\$56
Overweight	This fee is for pets who are either overweight or obese. The body condition of the pet is assessed by our veterinarian. This condition is considered a higher risk for surgery because the extra fat tissue makes the reproductive organ more fragile and more difficult for the doctor to isolate.	\$82	\$56
Blood Clotting Test	Buccal mucosal bleeding time (BMBT) is a test performed to evaluate the body's ability to clot by measuring how long it takes for a small incision on the inner lip to stop bleeding. This test is required for Dobermans & Doberman mixes who are pre-disposed to Von Willebrand's Disease. It is optional for all others.	\$30	\$30
Special Handling	This fee is for any animal who is fearful, aggressive, or over-active which requires additional team members, time, medication, and/or assistance from owners to handle their pet.	\$65	\$65
Post Operative Sedatives	This fee is for oral medications sent home to keep your pet calm for 14 days after surgery. This helps to prevent post-operative complications caused by activity that would potentially require treatment and/or surgical correction at a regular or emergency veterinarian.
